Council presented Assistant City Manager Ken Heerman with the Certificate of Achievement for Financial Reporting for the city's Comprehensive Financial Report. The city has been a recipient of this recognition for the last 23 years. The recognition is the highest tribute for government accounting and financial reporting given by the Government Finance Officers Association.

Mayor Wilcox presented a proclamation for Fire Prevention Week where the theme is "Don't Wait – Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every Ten Years." Fire Chief Brad Goudie shared the importance of installing working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors in every sleeping room and every level of the home. Mayor Wilcox also presented a proclamation declaring October 15, 2016 as Fallen Officer Day in Highland Village. The proclamation was made in support of the Highland Village Police Department's Fallen Officer Bike Race and 5K held for the last eight years in support of the Fallen Officer Fund.

Also during the Report, the [HVTV Update](#) informed residents of the events taking place to benefit the Fallen Officer Fund. Highland Village Restaurant Week will take place October 9-15 with participating restaurants donating a percentage of their sales to the Fund. The Fallen Officers Bike Race and 5K Run scheduled for October 15 and will include a Kids Zone, a Fallen Officer Memorial, live music, and vendor booths. The Update also informed residents of the Salute Our Veterans Luncheon scheduled for November 10 and requested sponsorship to allow veterans and a guest to attend at no charge.
