Council Reappoints Municipal Court Judge; Receives FY 2022-23 CIP Budget

At the June 28 meeting, Council reappointed Judge Colette Sallas as the presiding judge in Highland Village. Judge Sallas has served as the Judge for the Municipal Court of Record since 2016.

City Council began discussion of the FY 2022-23 budget with the Capital Improvement Program, which is a five-year outlook of the capital budget. This provides the framework for consideration of the current year's budget and resulting tax rate. Budget discussions will continue at each meeting through July and August.

Council approved the final read of an ordinance amending the Animal control ordinance. Three amendments were approved: 1) provide the ability to administratively reduce or waive animal fees; 2) change "bird" to "fowl" to provide consistency and reduce confusion in definitions of what types of birds the ordinance is applicable to; 3) allows a shorter than 50' distance from a residential structure of an adjacent property for the location of a coop, cage or pen with the written consent of the owner and residents of the adjacent property.

A task order was approved for engineering services for a water line replacement project on Sandero Drive, Bexar Drive, Victoria Drive and Malibu Drive. The project will replace the older lines that are made of asbestos cement with more durable and dependable PVC pipe. These streets are scheduled for street improvements so the City is working to replace the water lines before beginning the street improvement project.

During the Mayor and Council comments, Mayor Jaworski reminded residents of the joint City Council and Planning and Zoning workshop on Thursday, June 30 to receive a presentation from Poag, LLC regarding the Shops at Highland Village. The meeting is for informational purposes only, no action is taken and visitor comments are not included. The meeting is open to the public however seating is limited.
