Funding Approved for Area Nonprofit Organizations; TXFallenPD Tribute Event Donation Check Presented

At the November 14 meeting, Council approved funding for area nonprofit organizations. Each year the council allocates funds to support the nonprofit organizations providing essential services to the residents of Highland Village. City Resolution 2018-2729 sets out guidelines non-profit applicants must meet in order to request funding for community services provided to the residents of the City of Highland Village. The organization's services must be of economic benefit to the community or contribute to the quality of life in Highland Village by serving a municipal public purpose, they must be provided to the citizens of Highland Village on an equal basis and they must enter into a written contract with the City for the provision of services. The following are the organizations receiving funding:

Family Service Organizations: Christian Community Action (CCA) - \$4100, Denton County Friends of the Family - \$4100, Denton County MHMR Center - \$4100; Love Thy Neighbor - \$2500; Salvation Army – Lewisville - \$4100, SPAN Inc./Meals on Wheels - \$2106, Special Abilities of North Texas - \$4100

Children's Service Organizations: CASA of Denton County - \$3,000, Communities in Schools of North Texas - \$3500, Journey to Dream - \$4100, PediPlace - \$4100, Lewisville ISD Education Foundation - \$4100

Community Service Organizations: Chisolm Trail RSVP - \$2500, Friends of the Flower Mound Public Library - \$500, Lewisville Lake Symphony - \$4100, Studio B Performing Arts - \$4100; MLK of North Texas - \$1000

Police chief Doug Reim presented a donation check for \$61,723.12 to a representative from the Texas Police Chiefs Association Foundation. The donation is a culmination of the 2023 TXFallenPD Tribute Event, which took place on October 21, 2023. The fundraising goal was \$40,000. Since 2008, the Highland Village Police Department and the City of Highland Village have held an event to raise funds for the families of police officers killed in the line of duty in Texas. The event has grown each year. Events included TXFallenPD at National Night Out, a 5K run/walk, a civilian bike race, a Kid Ride with a Cop, a police bike race, kid zone, vendors, food trucks and live music. A video recap was prepared for the meeting.

During the Mayor and Council comments, Mayor Jaworski recognized Eli Albin as Mayor for the Day. Ms. Albin is in the fifth grade at Heritage Elementary School.

The Honor Our Veterans Ceremony took place before the Council meeting and honored two Highland Village veterans. The veterans are recognized on the Veterans Monument on the south side of the Municipal Complex. The veterans recognized are:
